



Issue No. 1 of 14 January 2010

- Appellate Body rules in China – Publications on the use of GATT Article XX as a defence outside the GATT
- The EU initials an agreement which ends the banana dispute
- EU Commission, EU Parliament, consumers and food industry divided on changes to EU food labelling rules
- China and the US reach an agreement in relation to the '*famous brands subsidies*' dispute

Issue No. 2 of 29 January 2010

- The imposition of quality standards for imported fruits and vegetables
- The WTO established a panel to rule on *Philippines – Taxes on distilled spirits*
- The future of sustainable packaging
- The European Court of Justice clarifies the definition of '*substantial processing or working*'

Issue No. 3 of 12 February 2010

- The EU increases its quantity of out-of-quota sugar exports
- Vietnam requests consultations with US concerning anti-dumping measures on frozen warm-water shrimp
- EU ecolabel: new trade barrier or opportunity for third country operators?
- China requests consultations concerning EU anti-dumping measures on certain footwear from China

Issue No. 4 of 26 February 2010

- The EU Commission proposes a ban on international trade in Atlantic bluefin tuna
- Revised guidance document on EU food law published
- China considers 'Buy China' policy for governmental investment projects

Issue No. 5 of 12 March 2010

- The EU Commission gives the green light to a genetically modified potato
- The US requests the WTO to review India's export subsidies for textile and apparel
- Draft Italian legislation on the use of substances other than vitamins and minerals in food supplements discussed at EU level
- The EU and Singapore launch FTA talks

Issue No. 6 of 26 March 2010

- Brazil issues preliminary list cross-retaliation
- EU Parliamentary Committee votes not to make colour coding compulsory for nutritional labelling
- Australia takes a controversial step backwards over beef imports
- The Court of Justice of the EU rules that minimum retail prices for cigarettes infringe EU law

Issue No. 7 of 9 April 2010

- Subsidiarity principle as new safeguard measure for GMO approvals in EU Member States?
- The EU Commission is considering opening an anti-subsidy investigation on Chinese coated fine paper
- The controversy over the imposition of carbon border taxes
- The US requests the establishment of a WTO panel in the *Philippines – Taxes on distilled spirits* dispute

Issue No. 8 of 23 April 2010

- Canadian Act on tobacco aimed at youth might constitute a technical barrier to trade

- The US expects increased market access for beef in 2012, while EFSA issues guidance on the submission of data for AMT proposals
- China blocks imports of Argentinean soybean oil
- Export restrictions on certain raw materials are increasingly being imposed by WTO Members

Issue No. 9 of 7 May 2010

- Draft on the Anti-Counterfeiting Trade Agreement made available to the public
- Discussion between Canada and the EU concerning upcoming EU fuel standards
- The European Parliament is exercising its right of scrutiny in relation to the approval of the food additive 'bovine and/or porcine thrombin', also known as 'meat glue'
- Feed-in-tariffs for renewable energy sources and WTO rules

Issue No. 10 of 21 May 2010

- Malaysia contemplates WTO case against the restriction of palm oil on the EU market
- The EU and the US express concerns in relation to Japan's planned postal reform
- Brazil requests WTO consultations with the EU over seizures of generic drugs in transit
- Argentina signals import bans of several foods

Issue No. 11 of 4 June 2010

- Turbulent imports of Indian table grapes into the EU due to public health considerations
- The negotiations on the special safeguard mechanism in the WTO heat up
- ECJ judgment on upper safe levels (USLs) for nutrient in food supplements
- Free trade agreement talks between the EU and the Gulf Cooperation Council were suspended

Issue No. 12 of 18 June 2010

- The EU Commission contemplates the introduction of a standardised EU-wide energy and carbon tax
- The EU Parliament votes on mandatory country-of-origin labelling for certain foodstuffs

- Indonesia requests the establishment of a WTO panel over the US clove cigarette ban
- The EU Commission unveils the first details of plans to fundamentally reform the approval system for GMOs in the EU and its Member States

Issue No. 13 of 2 July 2010

- The EU bans illegal timber and timber products
- EU Parliament's INTA Committee votes on the proposed EU regulation implementing the safeguard clause of the EU-Korea FTA
- EU Commission withdraws proposal for rules on organic wine production
- Brazil and the US agree on a framework for further negotiations in the wake of the cotton dispute

Issue No. 14 of 16 July 2010

- In the light of its new competences, the EU Commission publishes the EU investment package
- Discussions on whether WTO rules should apply to private sector standards in food safety and animal health revive
- Signs of progress in WTO talks on the liberalisation of trade in environmental goods
- The alleged Argentinean ban on food imports was discussed in the WTO Council for Trade in Goods

Issue No. 15 of 30 July 2010

- Parmesan cheese and Parma ham on the menu of the EU-Canada trade talks?
- Ukraine requests WTO consultations against Armenia's measures affecting the importation and internal sale of cigarettes and alcoholic beverages
- The panel report on the apple dispute between Australia and New Zealand will be released soon

Issue No. 16 of 10 September 2010

- The WTO dispute on Chinese export restrictions and the question of natural resources as recently exposed by the WTO Trade Report 2010
- EU General Court grants an injunction in benefit of Canadian industries and Inuit communities to suspend the effects of Regulation (EC) No. 1007/09 on the ban on seal products

- Dairy products and meat from cloned animals and their offspring: novel food or monster food?

Issue No. 17 of 24 September 2010

- Japan requests WTO consultations with Canada on Ontario's feed-in tariff programme
- The EU adopts new approach to GMO cultivation
- Oral statements delivered at the WTO in the US - COOL dispute
- EU Council authorises signature of the EU-South Korea Free Trade Agreement

Issue No. 18 of 8 October 2010

- The WTO panel in the dispute *US – Poultry Imports from China* issued its report
- The US aims at considering currency undervaluation as a countervailable subsidy
- The EU Commission plans to ban the addition of sugar to fruit juices
- The EU and Malaysia launch FTA talks

Issue No. 19 of 22 October 2010

- Regulations on 'plain packaging' of cigarettes: a case of WTO 'plain inconsistency'?
- EU Commission plans an '*omnibus decision*' and reviews the timetable for adoption of the list of permitted health claims made on foods
- Conclusion of the Anti-Counterfeiting Trade Agreement negotiations including a compromise on geographical indications
- Canada's policy on renewable energy is questioned in the context of government procurement under the EU-Canada trade talks

Issue No. 20 of 05 November 2010

- EU Parliament approves country-of-origin markings ('*Made in*') on non-EU goods
- US Trade Representative accepts petition against Chinese policies on green technologies
- EU Commission authorises a number of '*non-Article 13*' health claims (concerning reduction of disease risk and children's development and health) and rejects others

- In consideration of technical developments, the EU Commission approves a number of new food additives and new uses for previously-approved food additives

Issue No. 21 of 19 November 2010

- The EU Commission releases its blueprint for an EU trade policy
- Which risk assessments are being used for the establishment of the EU list of permitted flavouring substances?
- The WTO panel issued its report in the dispute Thailand – customs and fiscal measures on cigarettes from the Philippines

Issue No. 22 of 03 December 2010

- The European Court of Justice argues that ‘pure’ chocolate is ‘pure non-sense’
- WTO Members’ notification reveal breaches of the committed levels of agricultural domestic support as new export restrictions are adopted
- The EU bans the chemical Bisphenol A from plastic infant feeding bottles
- The EU Commission revised its preferential rules of origin for products imported under the GSP

Issue No. 23 of 17 December 2010

- US Senate approves bill extending subsidies on biodiesel blends and support measures for biodiesel production
- Formerly ‘generic’ *Dresdner Stollen* becomes protected geographical indication in the EU
- The EU agrees to amend its customs legislation to settle the WTO dispute with India over the seizure of generic drugs in transit
- The EU Council reached political agreement on a draft regulation on food information to consumers
