



Issue No. 1 of 14 January 2011

- The US requests WTO consultations with China over subsidies on wind power equipment
- The European Commission reports that complex SPS controls on imports of food need to be streamlined
- The US raises concerns about China's restrictions on rare earth exports
- The US may have violated the GATS by raising visa fees

Issue No. 2 of 28 January 2011

- Progress in the Canada-EU free trade agreement negotiations
- EU anti-dumping duties on footwear are set to expire by April 2011
- Reinforced EU legislation in response to the serious incident of dioxin contamination of animal feed?
- Breakthrough in the WTO negotiations for a wine/spirit GIs register

Issue No. 3 of 11 February 2011

- The EU Parliament's INTA Committee approves the regulation implementing the bilateral safeguard clause of the EU-South Korea FTA
- EU Member States may ban GM crops under arguable public order exception
- EU Committee of the Regions recommends introducing a logo for local food
- EU-Ukraine could sign Association Agreement in 2011

Issue No. 4 of 25 February 2011

- US requests formation of a WTO panel regarding China's treatment of US suppliers of electronic payment services
- New EU rules on 'comitology' set to enter into force on 1 March 2011

- Update on the EU proposal for a Food Information Regulation – mandatory nutrition declaration and introduction of mandatory ‘defrosted’ designation
- Canada requests the formation of a WTO panel regarding the EU’s ban on Canadian seal products

Issue No. 5 of 10 March 2011

- Brazil may initiate a WTO dispute regarding EU restrictions on poultry marketing regulations
- The EU plans to establish a threshold for GM presence in imported animal feed
- Trade concerns are affecting the possible adoption by the EU of a new novel foods regulation
- China may take WTO action against the EU over telecoms subsidies

Issue No. 6 of 24 March 2011

- Call for sanctions against Faroe Islands and Iceland in the Mackerel dispute
- Norway requests the establishment of a WTO panel regarding the EU’s ban on Norwegian seal products
- The EU and Malaysia could conclude FTA negotiations by June 2012
- Canadian compositional cheese standards upheld on appeal

Issue No. 7 of 8 April 2011

- The EU may place a ‘dirty fuel’ label on oil extracted from the Canadian oil sands
- Conciliation on novel foods regulation fails, impeding the adoption of new EU rules for the approval of innovative foods
- The WTO Committee on Sanitary and Phytosanitary Measures recommends five actions regarding private sector standards for food safety and animal and plant health

Issue No. 8 of 21 April 2011

- Brazil’s proposed tobacco legislation under scrutiny at the most recent meeting of the WTO Committee on Technical Barriers to Trade
- Environmental and socio-economic grounds cited as possible justification for EU Member States to ban or restrict GMO cultivation
- The EU is set to impose for the first time countervailing duties on imports from China
- The EU Commission publishes the Trade and Investment Barriers Report highlighting trade barriers faced by EU exporters in key trading partners

Issue No. 9 of 6 May 2011

- The EU may initiate a WTO dispute settlement over Chinese export credits
- Antigua and Barbuda may resort to WTO action in response to the US shutdown of three online gambling sites
- Proposed review of EU agricultural quality policy opens new business opportunities
- The EU may restrict access to its GSP scheme of tariff preferences

Issue No. 10 of 20 May 2011

- EU Parliament calls for new cloning regulations, which could affect many beef exporting countries
- Warning labels for sweetener aspartame introduced in the EU Food Information Regulation
- The EU Parliament has voted on an EU Commission draft regulation on transitional arrangements for BITs
- The EU and Japan discuss the launch of FTA negotiations

Issue No. 11 of 2 June 2011

- Remaining 'retaliatory' duties in the *EC – Hormones* dispute lifted by the US
- Report by EU Parliament foresees important changes to fruit juice proposal
- Ukraine requests the establishment of a WTO panel regarding Moldova's environmental charges
- Three issues reportedly remain unresolved in EU – Ukraine FTA talks

Issue No. 12 of 17 June 2011

- Controversy over 'plain packaging' for cigarettes in the WTO TRIPs Council
- EU yeast industry expresses concern over the EU Commission's sugar policies
- The WTO dispute settlement system is increasingly involved in disputes concerning subsidies granted to renewable energy industries
- Important round of talks approaching in the Canada – EU FTA negotiations

Issue No. 13 of 1 July 2011

- The WTO Appellate Body upholds the panel's ruling in *Thailand – Cigarettes from the Philippines*
- The EU Commission introduces the '*Trade Omnibus II*' proposal to reform trade policy decision-making

- The EU Commission proposes substantial changes to the regulatory framework for dietetic foods
- The EU and Indonesia will reportedly launch FTA talks in November 2011

Issue No. 14 of 15 July 2011

- Panel report issued in the WTO dispute on *China - Measures Related to the Exportation of Various Raw Materials*
- New EU food labelling rules may force operators to amend most food product labels
- The EU and Canada reach an agreement on equivalency of organic products
- The WTO releases latest trade policy review of the EU

Issue No. 15 of 29 July 2011

- The WTO Appellate Body upholds the panel's ruling in *EC - Fasteners from China*
- The WTO Dispute Settlement Body establishes a panel to examine measures applied by Canada in its renewable energy sector
- The EU adopts a 'technical low level presence' of non-approved GM material in imported feed
- The EU Commission outlines challenges of the next decade in the area of food safety, including environmental sustainability of the food chain

Issue No. 16 of 9 September 2011

- Panel report issued in the WTO dispute *US - Clove Cigarettes*
- Panel report issued in the WTO dispute *Philippines - Taxes on Distilled Spirits*
- A recent FVO report has found that Turkish regulation on the control of pesticide residues is improving
- The EU has requested WTO consultations with Canada regarding Ontario's alleged renewable energy subsidies

Issue No. 17 of 23 September 2011

- Panel report issued in the WTO *US – Tuna II (Mexico)* dispute
- Brazil initiates WTO talks on measures to mitigate currency exchange rates manipulations
- Judgement of the Court of Justice clarifies which rules apply to EU Member States' emergency measures concerning marketing authorisations for GMOs
- The EU-list of permitted 'generic' (i.e., 'Article 13') health claims on food products will be established by the end of 2011

Issue No. 18 of 7 October 2011

- Danish tax on saturated fat in some food comes into effect, within a trend in EU Member States to impose taxes on certain food categories
- The EU Commission proposed higher '*polluting values*' for tar sand fossil fuels under the EU Fuel Quality Directive
- The negotiations for the revision of the GPA are close to a conclusion
- EFSA completed its first opinions providing the scientific basis for the modernisation of meat inspection in the EU

Issue No. 19 of 21 October 2011

- The EU Council has authorised EU-wide investment protection negotiations with Canada, India and Singapore
- WTO Members voice concerns about Brazil's new tax regime on automobiles
- France bans Bisphenol A in all food packaging material as of 2014 further to an EU-wide ban on infant feeding bottles containing Bisphenol A
- Proposed amendments to the EU regime on bovine identification and voluntary labelling are notified to the WTO

Issue No. 20 of 4 November 2011

- The EU considers reforming 'dual-use' export authorisation regulations
- Russia moves towards WTO accession
- The EU still has not set maximum permitted levels of vitamins and minerals in food supplements
- China criticised at the WTO for failing to open its financial services market

Issue No. 21 of 18 November 2011

- EU ethanol producers have requested that the EU Commission investigate US fuel ethanol subsidies
- Peru ready to file a WTO complaint on Brazil's canned sardines technical regulation
- The EU Commission establishes lists of food additives which are permitted in the EU; however, new risk assessments are still to come
- Japan raises concerns with respect to China's export restrictions on rare earth elements

Issue No. 22 of 2 December 2011

- Panel report issued in the WTO dispute *US – COOL*
- Ferrero has been ordered by a German Court to change the nutrition labelling on Nutella as it is considered misleading
- The EU Advocate General stated that programming language and computer program functionalities should not enjoy copyright protection
- Turkey's 0% tolerance threshold for imports of food and feed with traces of GMO content is raising concerns within the international business community

Issue No. 23 of 16 December 2011

- The EU may impose new restrictions on palm-oil based biofuels
- The US Congress is set to consider extending the 54 USD cent tariff on imports of ethanol
- The ECJ has clarified the conditions of the customs detention of goods from non-EU Member States allegedly infringing intellectual property rights
- The EU Commission Standing Committee agrees on general function health claims, including proposed prohibition of about 2,000 claims
